George Capone

The Eastern PA Down Syndrome Center is pleased to announce Dr. George T. Capone as our opening keynote speaker for this year's conference. Dr. Capone is the Director of the Down Syndrome Program at the Kennedy Krieger Institute (KKI) in Baltimore, MD. He is a research scientist at KKI and is also an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He attended college at Wesleyan and worked as a research assistant at the Dana Farber Cancer Institute in Boston before obtaining his MD from the University of Connecticut in 1983. After a residency and fellowship in pediatrics at the Children's Hospital Medical Center in Cincinnati, Dr. Capone came to Baltimore in 1988 for a fellowship in neurobiology research at Johns Hopkins. He is currently an Attending Physician on KKI's Neurobehavioral Unit and Comprehensive Rehabilitation Unit. Dr. Capone lives in Towson, Maryland with his wife and two children.

Emmanuel Bishop

The Eastern PA Down Syndrome Center also welcomes Emmanuel Bishop. Emmanuel is 12 years old and lives in Southern Illinois where he is home schooled. Emmanuel's lists of accomplishments are many; he is bilingual, studies Suzuki violin, is tutored in French and Latin, plays golf and swims the 200 and 400 freestyle. His first speaking engagement was at the age of six. Since that time, Emmanuel has presented at many conferences, including the welcoming statement, in three languages, at the National Down Syndrome Society annual Congress Plenary Session.
